**SUBJECT:** Commission Policy Update: Appointment of Chair and Vice-Chair

#### RECOMMENDATION

By motion adopt the amended Policy on Appointment of Chair and Vice-Chair (Attachment One) and extend the term of the current Chair to sixteen months.

#### **BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS**

At its February 2, 2015 meeting, staff provided the Commission with an update on various items that were discussed at its January 12<sup>th</sup> workshop, including a review of the policy and procedure on appointment of the Commission's Chair and Vice-Chair. The Commission expressed dissatisfaction with the current policy, which automatically rotates the Chair and Vice-Chair positions each year on January 1<sup>st</sup>.

The current policy creates rotating one-year terms for the Chair and Vice-Chair beginning January 1<sup>st</sup> of each year. Under the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Act, all appointees to LAFCO serve terms beginning and ending in May. This can result in appointment of the Chair or Vice-Chair in January and their potential replacement as Commissioners only four months later in May.

While the timing of appointment and replacement of LAFCO members by their various appointing bodies under the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Act is not within the Commission's authority, the Commission can amend its policies and procedures so that the service of members as Chair or Vice-Chair better corresponds to their terms of office as LAFCO commissioners. After discussion, the Commission directed staff to draft amendments to the policy for appointment of the Chair and Vice-Chair to address this problem.

The attached amended policy would change the beginning of each term to May 1<sup>st</sup> rather than January 1<sup>st</sup>. If the terms of office of the Chair and Vice-Chair began May 1<sup>st</sup> rather than January 1<sup>st</sup>, the dates of appointment to the Commission would better coincide with beginning and ending dates of the Commission's terms of appointment for its Chair and Vice-Chair.

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If adopted, the Commission would also have to determine if the current Chair's term would be shortened to four months or extended to sixteen months. Staff recommends that the Commission, in clarifying the adoption of this policy amendment, extend the term of the current Chair to sixteen months.

Below is a summary of the proposed changes in the policy:

- Terms for Chair and Vice-Chair changed to begin May 1<sup>st</sup> to better align with City Selection Committee appointments
- Names of seat occupants updated to reflect current Commission roster
