a) Request for Extension of Time: *Wine Country Avenue No. 5 District Annexation to the Napa Sanitation District* (action)

The Commission will consider a request by the applicant on behalf of all affected property owners to extend by one year the deadline for completion of the terms and conditions imposed by LAFCO Resolution 05-11. The proposal was approved by the Commission on April 4, 2005, and is meant to facilitate the connection of four existing single-family residences to the NSD sewer system. b) Napa River Reclamation District No. 2109: Governance Study

The Commission will review a governance study evaluating government structure options relating to the Napa River Reclamation District No. 2109. The Commission will consider the recommendation of staff to transmit a copy of the study to the District for their review. (California Government Code §56378)
